## Residential Care Rates:

Applicants must be eligible for Social Security, Special Assistance, Medicaid and/or state funding sources if not paying privately. Rates will be the current approved domiciliary care rate.



**Application Process:** IDD homes are single gender, six bed homes and are alcohol and smoke free environments. We believe that a home should be a safe place where people can relax and feel comfortable. We consider not only the best interests of the applicant in our admission decisions but also the best interests of the other individuals in the home, as well as, the promotion of healthy and positive relationships

between housemates. Admission is offered only to individuals whose needs can be adequately met in our group home setting.

## Applicants must:

- be a legal resident of North Carolina
- be at least 18 years of age
- have a diagnosed intellectual/developmental disability
- be ambulatory or able to self-transfer
- be continent of bowel and bladder
- be free of any contagious or communicable disease
- be free from alcohol and/or drug addiction
- be able to communicate verbally or have a form of communication that can be understood by staff
- be capable of participating in a day program or job placement
- provide the home with a current psychological evaluation, medical history and social history including full disclosure of any mental health or behavioral support needs
